6. Please explain how you will spend the money, including how you will increase capacity or expand provision.

We will spend the money on furthering the work of Longbenton Youth Forum by setting up a weekly activity club involving young people [redacted] living in Longbenton ward, predominantly those living on [redacted]. We plan to tap into our community networks to identify young people currently not engaged in youth activities, those who are [redacted]. We have excellent connections with families experiencing [redacted] through our diverse services including Working Roots and HAF project. We know that there is a real need to engage young people living in [redacted] and support them to get involved in activities that are meaningful to them. We will set up a youth led activity group that will provide an opportunity for young people to engage in activities that will build confidence, self-belief and increase social and emotional well being.

We aim to provide a safe, inclusive, warm space for the group to meet. The Oxford Centre and our modular building which is located on our community garden site, will be two key locations.

We will launch the new group in August with an exciting fun Summer programme and the group will run through to mid March 2026.

As part, of our project will intend embedding environmental, climate and green energy workshops into the programme as we feel it is vital to raise aspirations around training and employment as a way of diverting young people from [redacted]. Our project will raise awareness of new training and employment opportunities emerging in Green energy which will bring brilliant long term prospects. We will seek to arrange visits to Newcastle collage's green energy academy based in Wallsend which recently received £8.5 million pounds to ensure young people living in the North West of the borough are fully aware of the new opportunities.

We will work with other organisations within the North West Forum, particularly the newly formed group Mini Miners. Through our HIVE project we are well connected within the three wards and will actively work alongside other groups/agencies to further the work of young people. We are keen to learn from others and share our experience.
